Father Rob's Reflections July 2021

Service times & overview of Parish Survey Results

Dear Holy Trinity Family,

Well, the results are in. 48 family units or individuals responded. That's a healthy showing. Prior to the COVID pandemic, 72.0% attended 10 am services and 27.1% attended 8 am. The key points are that 62.5% preferred two services when asked their preference of one service or two. If there were two service choices given as the option, 87.5% chose 8 am and 10 am just as before the pandemic. 89.4% plan to worship in person, in building while 10.6 percent, with some comments adding to this percentage, said virtually. In returning to in person, in building Holy Eucharist at 70.2% was the highest "most critical" for return to inside worship. 53.2% said coffee hour. 40.4% said choir resuming. 42.6 % said 2 services were a critical issue for them. Sunday School for children and adults came in at 17% each. Nursery was 14.9%.

While I want to study the other preferences to make decisions for the fall, etc., the key focus area, given various factors, is service times right now. So, in order to allow staff and the congregation time to adjust, this Sunday, July 4th, we will continue with 9:30 am Zoom and 11 am in person. But, the following Sunday we will have a trial run of return to 8 am Rite I Eucharist (no music) and 10 am Rite II. Our plan is that the second service will include a virtual element on Zoom and that recording will be uploaded later to Facebook and perhaps YouTube. We need to continue our Zoom approach, given the results of our survey, but three services is not feasible. Then, on July 18th, we will have one service at 11 am with the Bishop, followed by a gathering to greet her. She requires 11 am for traveling purposes. The previous Thursday at 6:30 pm the Bishop will

meet with Vestry, as she normally does for visits but via Zoom. After the Sunday gathering, Auburn Watersong will lead us, the Vestry, that afternoon in a ministry reflection time from the past year. My vacation begins July 19th thru August 16th. My supply Clergy will have the 8 am and 10 am service schedule that we just tried out on July 11th, with Eagan Murphy, our new AV/TECH Facilitator, running the Zoom during the 10 am service. There will be a TV monitor up front, off to the side, for you to see who is on Zoom and for them to participate in the service. Yes, you'll be able to see and hear Dawn and others on Zoom, just like they were with us. (Disclaimer: we are working on this now and the additional week to get it set up and tested is one of the many reasons we will try out 8 and 10 schedules on July 11th not July 4th. Fingers crossed please.)

I hope this helps. For now, masks remain as a support to our under 12 youngsters, as a role model to them, and support to immuno-compromised and unvaccinated. But I will repeat, as I said last Sunday, if the school system in August decides that children may come, vaccinated or unvaccinated, to school without masks, then upon my return I will work quickly on turning masking over to personal choice. So, much is getting back to a new way of normal. The worldwide pandemic is not over no matter how well Vermont is doing, but we are getting here.

Prayer for Independence Day

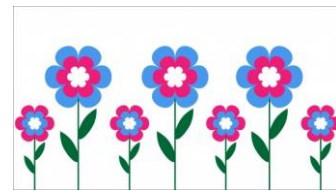
