The Team will hold mock interviews with Ann and/or Fran on zoom to work out any kinks in the process. Ann and Fran have agreed to a six-month extension to our Letter of Agreement, or until call of new rector, whichever comes first. We will continue to work on addressing issues of communication and healing, as well as a planned teaching series during Lent.

Your continued prayers for the Transition Team and Vestry will be appreciated as we launch the next phase of the transition process. Fran+


Priest-in-Charge Message

Good Morning,

On behalf of the Vestry of Holy Trinity I wanted to share an update with the parish about St. John's Highgate.

Rational for current decision-making process: The unsolicited call inquiring about purchase of the historic church was reported to the HT vestry Nov 11. The vestry decided to have a parish conversation to get a better sense of current interest in maintaining the 2003 agreement with the Diocese to take stewardship responsibility for St John's or to relinquish said responsibility to the Diocese of Vermont. The conversation concluded with a straw poll (20 forms were submitted) indicating a strong interest to continue oversight of St. Johns (6 votes) and equally strong sentiment to return the oversight to the Diocese (14 votes). There is no way of knowing how many other members of HT would prefer keeping or relinquishing responsibility for St. John's, however, the strength of sentiment expressed by those members interested in revitalizing program and investing time and effort to do so, is significant. A significant number members. while of acknowledging spiritual and the historical importance of St. John's, do not see how the human and fiscal resource of Holy Trinity can sustain St. John's. The vestry discussed the options in more depth at the Dec. 11 meeting and became aware of efforts by parishioners and friends of the parish for revitalization of the mission and ministry of St. John's. Therefore, a time should be set for a presentation and discussion as to what can be done at St. John's that enhances the mission and ministry of Holy Trinity, what would be the costs, how would it be funded and who would be needed to do the work.

The team of individuals excited and deeply interested in program development at St. John's are invited to submit a more detailed proposal to the vestry of HT at the Feb.12, 2024 Vestry Meeting. The proposal should address how current funds (St. John's Vicar's Fund and interest from St. John's endowments) and potential generation of new income would be used to sustain a program relevant to the interests and needs of the Swanton-Highgate community. A detailed (as possible) budget should be submitted. It is important to recognize that details include responsible parties for work related to St. John's without dependence on HT staffing (with the understanding that a new rector may or may not prefer to participate in services or activities at St. John's). Services planned for St. John's should therefore not replace or overlap with the services at HT. It is the intent of the vestry to respect energy for ministry in diverse forms. There is clearly energy connected to the St. John's church. During interviews of candidates, some Transition Team members will be asking questions while others will observe and take notes. The initial interview of candidates will be conducted via Zoom after we mock interview our interim rectors, Ann and Fran. When we identify a candidate we feel will be a good match for Holy Trinity, they will be invited to visit our parish to meet the Vestry, tour the area, and Rectory. After the candidate's visit, the Vestry will decide if a contract will be offered. The exciting news is our consultant has had inquiries from Rectors about our position. Holy Trinity Episcopal Church Service Scholarship

The Holy Trinity Episcopal Church Service Scholarship is open to all area students who are in pursuit of a higher education. Candidates for this scholarship have demonstrated a commitment to service in their community. When possible, one of the scholarships, will be offered to a present Holy Trinity Parish Member. Each year, Holy Trinity will offer at least two \$1,000 scholarships to individuals who apply and demonstrate successful completion of service projects which have benefited the greater community within Franklin County.

This scholarship will be awarded upon successful completion of a first semester or after documentation of completion of an alternative program.
