Have y'all heard about the GRACE Trail at Hard'ack? It is a new feature that has been incorporated into one of the existing hiking trails. The purpose of it is to give those who walk it the opportunity to access inner wisdom, courage, and hope by providing space to pause, reflect, and reconnect.

Along it there are five places to stop – one for each letter in the word grace. At each stopping place there is a bench for you to sit if you wish and a sign inviting you to consider a question.

I took to the trail a few days ago. It was a lovely 45-minute wander through the woods on a beautiful fall afternoon in Vermont. I paused for a moment at each place and when I continued walking, I took each question with me and pondered it as I walked to the next. It was an active way to help me reflect and to consider anew the paths my life as taken as well as what I can and should release...and embrace.

I encourage you to take the time to walk this trail – it is well groomed and a relatively easy walk. Maybe we could do a group trip there one of these days! If, for whatever reason you cannot walk the trail, here are the questions for you to consider:

- What am I GRATEFUL for?
- What do I need to RELEASE?
- What do I need to ACCEPT?
- What is my next CHALLENGE?
- What can I EMBRACE as possible?

And here is a really cool part about this: this trail in St. Albans is not the only one! There are 10 of them across the country; 8 created during the pandemic. The one at Hard'ack is the first in Vermont! AND....you don't even have to "walk" one - it has been adapted for use in meetings and on retreats.
