Chosen by the One who does the choosing

- From the Rector

So, it's been a year or near enough. Three quarters of my family moved to Vermont on September 25, 2024 (Jonathan followed a couple months later), my first day in the office was September 3, my first Sunday with you was September 8. AND we just had our Celebration of Ministry – truly a glorious evening.

The title of this month's musing from me is a statement that I've heard several times and has always been powerful for me. It is God who does the choosing. We are allowed to say no...or "I don't think so." But if it is truly a call from God it is nearly impossible to walk away from such a choosing. This echoes, I believe, a good bit of what our guest preacher, Rev. Flo Ledyard (wasn't she spectacular?), said to all of us at the Celebration of Ministry. In particular she gave us six things to consider and remember. Here they are (in compact form):

- 1. If a call is divinely initiated than God is in control...not us.
- 2. God's call requires us to be open to God's word AND requires us to speak God's word and to work for God's justice
- 3. God's call will likely send us beyond our comfort. But that's okay – because God doesn't call the equipped, God equips the called. We will have all we need.
- 4. God rejects our rejections because God is in charge. Trust in God is at the heart of any call. Having awareness and trust in God's presence and promises drives out any
- 5. We are to have Biblical forbearance with one another. That is – have grace, humility, and tenacious love which will weave a parish together. Be a community that reminds each other of God's presence.
- 6. Rejoice because God is with us! Joy is incomplete if not shared.

She also encouraged us to imagine what we can be and do together. It has been a wonderful year. It was a powerful service on August 21. The One who does the choosing chose us to work and walk together. I am excited for what lays ahead of us.

Season of Creation

During the Sundays from September 7 – October 5 you may notice that some of our language will change a bit. The collects of the day will not sound like ones you know. Our youth education program is open to all ages. Our weekly lessons will include stories, reflections, art activity, and singing along with snacks and a beverage.

Our religious education program will begin on Sunday, September 14th. Classes begin at 9:45 and last about 45 minutes each week. Children return to our regular church service at the beginning of the communion service.

We will also be offering nursery coverage for younger children ages birth-3 years old.

Note: As a special resource this year, we will be using the quilt created by Kay Benedict as a resource and example for our Sunday School Curriculum art project. Please make sure to check the art wall in the parish hall for the historical background for the quilt Kay has displayed. Thank you Kay!

ART WALL

On the Art Wall this month is a display about the story quilts of Harriet Powers (1837-1910). Powers was an African American woman who was born into slavery in the state of Georgia. She is remembered for her two quilts, The Bible Quilt (1885, in the collection of the Smithsonian), and The Pictorial Quilt (1897, owned by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston). Both quilts depict stories from the Bible, and one of them also illustrates several 19th-century astronomical events, including two meteor showers. (Photos of both quilts are posted in the Parish Hall.)

The quilt hanging on the Art Wall was inspired by Harriet Powers and her story quilts, and designed by Jan Patek. The quilt, made in 2017, is in a primitive folk-art style that depicts Bible stories from the Creation through Jesus's resurrection.
