☐ Baptism: Ceremonial rite of initiation into the Christian faith.

☐ Confirmation: The strengthening of baptized for continued life in and with the Church. This presumes that the person has been baptized and is making a conscious decision to receive the prayers of the Bishop and the laying on of hands.

☐ Reception: This is a rite for individuals previously confirmed in certain other Christian churches. These churches include, but are not limited to: Anglican Churches, Roman Catholic Church, the Orthodox Church.
