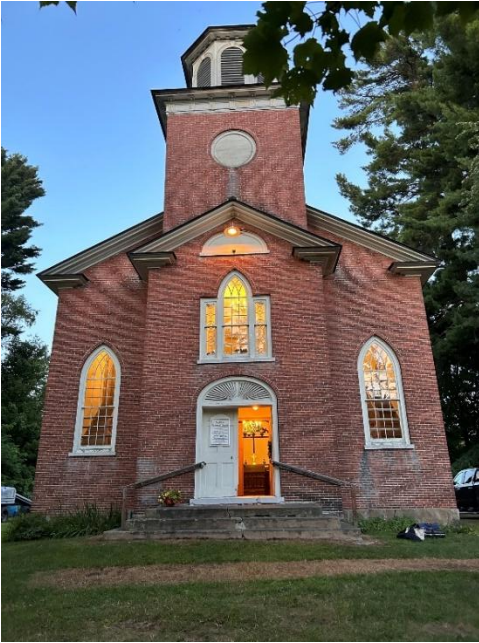


ORGAN RECITAL – AUGUST 16, 2026

Evensong at 3 PM, Organ Recital at 3:30 PM.

St. John's Church, 161 Park Street, Highgate.



Join us for Evensong at 3 PM. Rooted in the Anglican and Episcopal traditions, the service is designed to offer a peaceful, meditative pause at the end of the day. Primarily sung psalms, scripture readings and prayers.

At 3:30 we'll have a recital with a few organists: Kay Benedict, Karl Fandrich, and Erik Kenyon. The organ was built by Henry Erben of New York City in 1836. It has the distinction of being the oldest unaltered pipe organ in Vermont in its original location. Using the organ requires an assistant to hand pump the lever that operates the bellows. The acoustics are excellent.



St. John's Church was built in 1829-1830 by Joel Whitney of Enosburg. In 1835, the chancel and vestry room were added through the generosity of S. W. and S. S. Keys. In 1836, the church was presented with a bell, a font of Italian marble, a silver communion service and books for the altar, and lectern and pulpit by the Hon. Heman Allen, a son of Heber Allen, nephew of Ethan and adopted son of Ira Allen.
